THE DRAWING ROOM


Guests used this room to relax in. Look at the wallpaper. The red dye comes from crushed beetle shells!

TICK THESE THINGS OFF AS YOU SPOT THEM.




THE BEDROOM

In the 1740s he rebuilt the House in the 'classical style' inspired by ancient Greek and Roman art. This triangular shape is called a pediment. How many can you find on the front of Lydiard House? Answer: side 1

Look for the picture of a horse over the fireplace. It belonged to Frederick, 3rd Viscount St John, who lived here in the 1700s. He was super rich and spent his money on race horses, gambling, drinking, expensive clothes - and girls!
